- Could receive a ACT National Career Readiness Certificate
 - Used to document essential skills linked to workplace success
 - Recognized by the Industry

- You need to be able to:
 - Learn
 - Listen
 - Communicate

- Score is determined by the number of correct answers



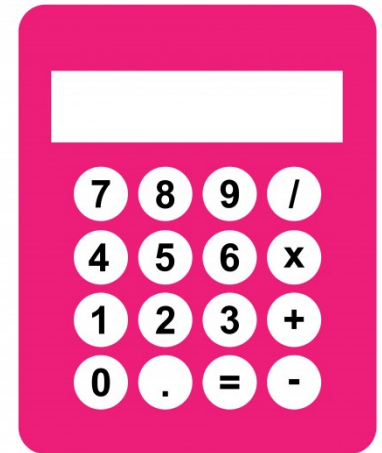

Locating Information

- 38 questions-Test 3
- 45 minutes
- Measures the skill people use when they work with workplace graphics
- Compare, summarize and analyze information found in related graphics

National Career Readiness Certificate

The NCRC™ is a credential that is

- Evidence-based
- Industry-recognized
- Portable
- Used to document essential skills linked to workplace success
- Awarded at four levels:
Bronze, Silver, Gold,
and Platinum



NCRC Certificate

- Certificates
 - Level 6 and above: Platinum
 - Level 5: Gold
 - Level 4: Silver
 - Level 3: Bronze
- Requirements

Based on minimum common score

For example, Level 5 on Applied Mathematics, Level 5 on Reading for Information, and Level 4 on Locating Information will result in a Silver NCRC – based on the minimum common
